Nhlanhla was 9 years old when he first walked through the gates of Emthonjeni to join the aftercare centre - 12 years ago. Like many other boys in Zandspruit, Nhlanhla grew up with few opportunities. Golang became a second home for this young man. As a teenager, he joined the Youth and developed into a role model and leader in his own right. At the beginning of 2014, Golang decided to appoint him as caregiver for the 10-11 year olds at the Aftercare. What a joy to see this young man interacting with the children who come to Golang! 'Hi Bra Nhlanhla, High Five". "We salute you, Bra Nhlanhla - Thank you for giving back to your community!"

OUR PARENTS ARE IMPORTANT TO US:

Golang does not want to operate without the buy-in of the parents. Over the year we have built valuable relationships and for the past two years two of our experienced staff members, Eunice Hlatswayo and Anna Nyaphuli also present termly Parent Workshops, where
